



**Dear Friends:** 

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I am pleased to submit to you, our members, Marin Conservation League's 2007 Annual Report. As MCL's President, I want to thank you for your continued support as we look forward to celebrating our 75th year in 2009. Few environmental organizations can equal MCL's remarkable achievements in land preservation or its history of environmental activism in Marin County! You continue to be a vital part of this heritage.

The history of Marin Conservation League teaches us that we must always look ahead to the future even as we celebrate the past. 2007 was a year in which the scope of MCL's environmental activism expanded. Many of our activities during the year concerned land and natural resource-related issues. These have been the focus of MCL for decades – plans and development proposals that continue to need attention, such as the still-pending Master Plan for Lawson's Landing, where unregulated recreation continues to threaten the sensitive Tomales Bay Dunes; an ill-advised plan for a massive sports complex near the wetlands at San Rafael Airport; the environmental effects of operations at the San Rafael Rock Quarry; and risks to Petaluma Marsh from proposed expansion of the Redwood Landfill.

You will also find emerging issues on MCL's "docket," such as global warming, sustainability, and community choice aggregation ("Marin Clean Energy"). These and similar issues enlarge MCL's scope of interest beyond the County, to address regional and even global concerns. The MCL Board of Directors now includes experts in green building, energy conservation, greenhouse gas emissions, and carbon sequestration. In time, these issues will take us into uncharted territory that could include sea-level rise and vegetation shifts in a changing environment.

One of MCL's outstanding accomplishments of 2007, in collaboration with other environmental organizations, was our part in Marin County's Countywide Plan Update after a lengthy public process. Here too, the Plan, approved in November 2007, reflects a transition as it captures both traditional land use and natural resource issues as well as forward-looking concerns of sustainability, the Plan's overarching theme. Many recommendations of the environmental community, such as designation of a Baylands Corridor, found their way into the approved Plan. MCL can also report that efforts to protect special lands in Marin, through our Lands in Between campaign, continue to garner successful collaborations with local community activists. Our popular quarterly "Business Breakfast" series again featured speakers on topics of mutual interest to the environmental and business communities of Marin, such as zero waste and new trends in organic agriculture.

Please take a moment to review these and other activities listed in the 2007 Action Calendar. Without you, our members, they would not have been possible. As MCL continues into 2008, responding to both traditional and new environmental challenges, we need your support more than ever. Your contribution, in any amount, in the enclosed envelope will provide that support.

Thanks to all of you who cared about MCL and its work in 2007! Sincerely,



The Statement of Activities summarizes MCL's financial results for the calendar year. The figures are from MCL's books and records and are unaudited.

In 2007 MCL had an overall gain, as did MCL's Unrestricted (Operations) and Board Restricted (Legacy of the Land endowment) Funds. Only the Temporary Restricted Fund ran a deficit. This was expected as this fund holds money which is earmarked for specific projects or purposes. In 2007, more was spent on these projects than was received.

The Unrestricted Fund pays for MCL's day-to-day programs and advocacy. The gain in 2007 is primarily the result of prudent management of MCL's resources. This year was only the second year since 2000 in which MCL had a gain in its operations. This year's operating gain was used to restore a portion of MCL's operating reserves which were used to pay for deficits in prior years.

We thank you for your past and continuing support of MCL's work.



#### MCL Credo

Works to preserve and protect the natural resource values and assets of Marin, focusing our action on issues of countywide significance or issues which may prove to be precedent-setting. We place particular emplasis on those issues having important land use implications or impacts on Marin's environment and quality of life. We look for effective solutions through our own advocacy efforts as well as through working in close collaboration with other organizations to address major environmental challenges and concerns in Marin.

### Marin Conservation League 2007 Action Calendar

#### *JANUARY*

- Advocated for the preservation of a 135 acre community separator between the San Geronimo and Nicasio Valleys as part of the Ferrari Subdivision Tentative Map and Precise Development Plan.
- Supported efforts to protect the Tomales Dunes and coastal wetlands from excessive recreational development at Lawsons' Landing a continuing effort led by EAC of West Marin involving both County and California Coastal Commission.
- Recommended that the County develop comprehensive policies and procedures to govern siting, design and operation of wind energy conservation systems (WECS) in Marin, to ensure that environmental impacts of this renewable energy resource are addressed.

#### **FEBRUARY**

- Continued to fund removal of invasive species as part of a long term project on Gold Hill, San Rafael.
- Made recommendations for existing and planned access points for the Marin County segment of the Bay Area Water Trail.
- Pledged educational funding assistance for KRCB Television documentary, "Moments in Time", on saving Marin's coast.
- Successfully advocated for the establishment of a fourth corridor the Baylands Corridor, a key component in updating the Marin Countywide Plan and for the Corridor to cover St. Vincent's and Silveira Ranch lands to Highway 101.

#### *MARCH*

- Hosted Business Breakfast featuring State Assembly representative Jared Huffman.
- Supported Ross Valley Watershed Flood Control Measure.
- Supported passage of AB541 barring genetically engineered crops and allow recovery of damages in local courts from genetically engineered (GE) crop contamination.
- Submitted comments to Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA) on alternative plans to restore wetlands and Redwood Creek at Big Lagoon in Muir Beach.

#### **APRIL**

- Participated in the lengthy planning process for Loch Lomond, San Rafael, to reduce the number of proposed residential units, ensure wetland and shoreline protections, and alleviate future traffic congestion
- Awarded Amy Meyer, author of "New Guardians for the Golden Gate" and co-chair of People for a Golden Gate National Recreation Area, the Peter Behr Lifetime Achievement Award at the MCL Annual Dinner.
- Participated in the AAA car battery recycling program in conjunction with Earth Day.

#### MAY


- Completed interpretive signage for the Starkweather Shoreline Park, San Rafael.
- Opposed construction of a Home Depot "Big Box" store on the Hanna Ranch property in Novato.
- Supported the work of Sustainable San Rafael to establish Green Building policies and ordinances in the City of San Rafael.
- Protected public health by opposing SB651, a state law that would allow lead in drinking water.

#### *IUNE*

- Supported State Climate Change and Water Resource Protection Act of 2007 (AB 224), which requires water agencies to incorporate impacts of climate change into water planning and quantify energy savings and greenhouse gas emissions associated with alternative supplies.
- Worked with Transportation Authority of Marin (TAM) and CalTrans to ensure that the Highway 101 Marin-Sonoma Narrows Widening Project will not degrade seasonal wetlands or San Antonio Creek habitats.
- Urged the State Parks Supervisor to prepare an EIR before considering changing several trails in Marin County State Parks from primarily hiker/equestrian use to a multi-use concept allowing bicycling.

#### **JULY**

- Reviewed the precise development plan for Binford Road Storage Project and submitted comments to County staff identifying shortfalls in project compliance with environmental provisions.
- Led a group-walk along Starkweather Shoreline Park trail in conjunction with hosting the Annual Picnic on the Porch for MCL members.
- Initiated an in-depth study of green energy options for Marin county communities under the Community Choice Aggregation law (aka "Marin Clean Energy").

#### **AUGUST**

- Nominated Hanna Ranch site in Novato for ABAG's Priority Conservation Area Designation.
- Conducted site visits and advised the Town of Tiburon to analyze significant impacts on ridgelines and woodland habitat and ensure adequate protections for the proposed "Alta Robles" development along Paradise Drive.
- Encouraged County officials considering Measure C Spending Implementation Plan for College of Marin to focus on impacts to existing natural assets of each campus.
- Urged CalTrans and TAM to select the environmentally preferable alternative for the proposed Highway 101 Marin-Sonoma Narrows HOV Widening Project.

#### **SEPTEMBER**

- Alerted city officials to potential environmental issues associated with a Target "Big Box" store proposed for land near the bay shoreline in east San Rafael.
- Hosted "Zero Waste" Business Breakfast with guest speakers Patty Garbarino, President of Marin Sanitary Service, and Robert Haley, Zero Waste Manager, San Francisco Department of Environment.
- Led Coastal Clean Up at the Starkweather Shoreline Park in San Rafael.
- Opposed an extensive residential remodel that would encroach into the Streamside Conservation Area in Kent Woodlands, setting a precedent.

#### **OCTOBER**

• Commented on Draft EIR for a massive Recreational Facility proposed near San Rafael Airport, which would compromise wetlands and endangered species habitat of Las Gallinas Creek and impact local neighborhoods with traffic, noise, and night lighting.

#### **NOVEMBER**

- Hosted "Protecting Marin County Lands" Business Breakfast with Guest speakers Sharon McNamee, Marin County Director of Parks and Open Space & Ken Massucco, Fire Chief for the Marin County Fire Department.
- Celebrated the Supervisors' adoption of the 2007 Updated Countywide Planwhich included many policies initiated by the environmental community.
- Joined an Amicus Brief in support of Novato's petition for injunction vs. North Coast Railroad Authority, on the grounds that the intended operation of the railroad, as well as repair and upgrade of all segments of the rail line, should receive comprehensive environmental analysis in an EIR.
- Opposed granting of an access easement over the railroad for potential future development of site adjacent to Corte Madera Ecological Reserve and the flood-managed Corte Madera Shorebird Marsh.
- Supported concept that the next "round" of redevelopment at Northgate Shopping Mall should include a potential for mixed-uses with affordable housing.

#### **DECEMBER**

- Alerted the County to cumulative impacts from the proposed "Sorokko Land Division and Master Plan" on Paradise Drive, Tiburon, focusing on fragmentation of oak woodland habitat, visual impacts along Paradise Drive, and the oversized scale of proposed new residential building envelopes.
- Discussed as a long-term alternative to expansion of Redwood Land-

fill the need for Marin to develop Zero Waste solutions and incorporate Zero Waste into Marin's five year Integrated Waste Management Plan.

#### COUNTYWIDE PLAN

Throughout the year, MCL focused on the following aspects of the Countywide Plan:

- Encouraged the adoption of a new environmental resource protection area, the BAYLANDS CORRIDOR to give greater recognition of and protection to the tidelands, marshes, diked lands, and adjacent, largely undeveloped upland habitats consisting of grasslands, oak savannahs and creeks entering the Bay.
- Argued for reduction in overall square footage of new commercial development.
- Fought for limiting densities and per cent of land cover for new development on St. Vincent's and Silveira Ranch lands, resulting in adoption of a 212 unit limit (100 affordable) or a senior living facility generating traffic no greater than that of the lowest allowable density for land within the Bayfront Corridor.
- Urged adoption of a proposed Plan policy requiring that adequate, long term water supply be verified for all new developments prior to approval, and, where supply is insufficient, that new developments offset demand so that there is no net increase in demand for new water.
- Advocated for refining the definition of "sustainability" in the Plan and tightening targets for reduction of Greenhouse Gas Emissions from County sources.
- Participated in numerous Planning Commission hearings on the Draft Plan and its EIR.


