Dear Mr. Janofsky:

The Marin Conservation League has followed the evolution of Redwood Landfill over the last twenty years and supported the Mitigated Alternative for the last Solid Waste Facility Permit. The proposed expansion and upgrading the composting element of the Facility Permit appears to be consistent with the goals of the Marin Integrated Waste Management Plan and the Countywide Plan for waste reduction and reuse.

We applaud the effort to fulfill one of the anticipated improvements identified in the 2008 FEIR Review of the Solid Waste Facility Permit (SWFP) for the expanded and upgraded composting operation appears to be complete with adequate controls and reporting requirements. We feel confident that this facility will facilitate the reduction of disposed green and food waste, the reduction of greenhouse gases and the production of useable high quality compost.

Marin Conservation League supports the proposed SWFP for processing compostable materials.
