-Plant Right's Annual Report. Volunteer needed to work with Plant Right to focus on small nurseries in Marin to stop selling invasives.

-Initiation of the county supervisor's public education and outreach program to minimize the use of pesticides. We need someone to liaise with them and ensure they include information on invasive plants and non-herbicidal treatments in the program.
