Measure A Funding initiative:

David Long: See what Cal Fire is doing re fire prevention. It is more capable than local agencies. Also, we need to advocate strategically for local agencies to use Best Management Practices (BMPs) for vegetation management to increase the quality of the management. Measure A management projects should include demonstration projects, and the county should promulgate grant requirements. County could give an award for the most innovative project. Project managers should be peer leaders.

Nona: The best local examples of BMPs for invasive plant projects are in the County Vegetation Management Plan and the draft MMWD vegetation management plan. Janet Klein of MMWD could give a presentation on invasive plant control.

Nona: We need to focus on 3-4 cities w either key resources, political support (like San Anselmo's open space group) or key political leaders.

Paul: Our message should be that open spaces are being destroyed by invasives, both ecologically and aesthetically, and this is qualitatively different from other park and open space maintenance issues, which typically concern maintenance and replacement of developed facilities with a defined life span. Local governments have a stewardship and fiduciary responsibility to future generations.
