MMWD Watershed Protection Manager and Chief Ranger Bill Hogan, retiring this month after 30 years with the water district, will share his observations about current and future watershed protection issues, and provide some historical perspective on visitation on watershed lands. Marin Municipal Water District is the largest landowner on Mount Tamalpais, a globally renowned habitat as well as the major source of drinking water for most of Marin County. In his dual position, Mr. Hogan has been responsible for watershed protection operations and services, as well as managing watershed enforcement operations, public access activities, wildland firefighting, search and rescue, and emergency medical services.
